Overview:

To provide the highest standard of medical care for all Paediatric patients and maintain confidentiality. All patients are under the care of a Consultant with admitting rights. It is the responsibility of the RMO to follow precisely the written instructions given by the Consultant concerned.

The RMO shall monitor the condition of patients in close liaison with the senior nursing staff, identifying any patient whose condition has changed to a degree where a deviation from the initial instructions for that patient is necessary. In such cases, the RMO will normally contact the Consultant concerned by the telephone before commencing treatment. Only where immediate medical intervention is judged necessary, should the RMO take direct action before contacting a Consultant.

The RMO is required to be conversant with all aspects of Paediatric resuscitation. He/she should have the ability to initiate and control Cardio-pulmonary resuscitation, intubate and defibrillate as appropriate. The RMO should be trained to advanced Paediatric cardiac life support level or recognised equivalent.

The RMO is also required to be conversant with all Hospital policies and procedures and to attend all mandatory training sessions.

Main Duties:

1. To receive a daily handover from previous RMO with regards to any patient problems, and then to visit all areas under sphere of responsibility following handover to liaise with nurse in charge with regards to routine duties, i.e. prescriptions, tasks, etc. A walk round of all patients must be completed by 10.00am each morning, with a last visit to the ward by 10.00pm each night.
2. To visit the ward on a minimum two hourly basis during the day as a matter of routine.
3. To clerk any patients at the Consultants/Nurse in Charge request.
4. To attend, examine and reasonably treat all accidents/incidents involving patients and visiting children, completing all documentation accurately, and legibly.
5. To initiate treatment for emergency admissions.
6. To transfer patients own drugs onto the patient's prescription chart in line with Hospital Drug Administration Policies.
7. To prescribe any requested drugs in line with Hospital Drug Administration Policies.
8. To prescribe any discharge drugs in line with Hospital Drug Administration Policies.
9. To perform ECG's, take blood, and where necessary commence intravenous infusions, and administer intravenous drugs in line with Hospital Administration Policies and Infection Control Policies.
10. To carry a key to Pharmacy out of hours and dispense in-patient and out-patient requirements in accordance with the Pharmacy Out of Hours Policy. (All RMO's will be orientated to the Pharmacy Department).
11. To sign as received Pharmacy key and Paediatric RMO bleep when daily handover between RMO's takes place.
12. To visit any patient at the Nurse in Charge's or multi-professional teams request on a non-emergency basis.
13. All changes in treatment shall be carried out in consultation with the Consultant ultimately responsible for the patients care.
14. To attend immediately, give advice, liaise with Consultants, nursing staff and multi-professional teams, and initiate treatment for any patient in an emergency situation.
15. To ensure when patients are seen that all necessary records and documentation are completed, accurate and legible.
16. To provide appropriate medical advice to patients who phone the hospital.
17. To provide medical cover for all Paediatric patients on a 1:5 rota.

Applications are invited for a 12 Programmed Activity (48 hours per week) middle grade Doctor in Worthing Emergency Department to start from August 2009. In accordance with national terms and conditions, this post includes 1 SPA per week for CPD, management and teaching activities. This post is suitable for a senior experienced doctor looking to join the hard-working and friendly management team. There are weekly well evaluated training sessions, monthly morbidity and mortality meetings, and bimonthly management meetings to which the post holder will be expected to contribute.

Applicants should have a minimum of 3 year's experience in emergency medicine and be at least 4 years post full registration. We will work towards the postholder achieving postgraduate qualifications if appropriate. ATLS or ALS or APLS provider status is mandatory and places on relevant courses are available to maintain current certification.

The post holder will join a medical team of 4 consultants, 8.6 middle grade doctors, including this post, and 10 junior doctors in training.

65,000 patients attend the Emergency Department each year, with less than 6% returns and no review clinics. There is a full shift system in operation, ensuring a middle grade presence on the 'shop-floor' 24/7.

All major specialties are present on site. There is a well established ENP service and observation ward. The department is developing an ultrasound service. Primary angioplasty and stroke thrombolysis are available on site.

Main Duties:

- Excellent care of patients presenting to the Emergency Department and on the observation ward.
- Referral of patients to appropriate in-patient facilities as appropriate.
- Care of critically ill patients and resuscitation of patients in the Emergency Department.
- Supervision of trainees.
- Involvement in Emergency Department multi-disciplinary team meetings.
- Involvement in patient queue management.
- Teaching and supervision of junior medical staff and nursing staff and active participation in SHO tutorials.
- Involvement in relevant administration duties (e.g. in rota schedules)
- Active involvement in audit and the development of departmental policies.
- Play an active role in the day to day management and administration of the Emergency Department.
- Internal cover is built into the middle grade rota for annual leave and sick leave.

The NHS Trust operates across two main sites. The Trust serves a population of around 700,000, from a wide range of social and ethnic groups, making it one of the largest acute hospital trusts in England.

The Trust operates two A&E departments, alongside other acute services consisting of all the major specialties of large district general hospitals.

2. Comply with the agreed job plan, which will be reviewed annually.
3. Participate in an emergency out of hours on call cover.
4. Contribute to postgraduate and continuing education for medical, nursing, technical staff, GP's and other allied professions.
5. Deputise in the absence of departmental colleagues in cases of annual leave and (where practicable) short-term sickness.
6. Contribute (in co-operation with the Audit Committee) on a regular basis to the clinical audit process undertaken within the Trust, and where appropriate at a broader regional level.
7. Encourage and participate in appropriate research initiatives approved by the local Ethical Committee. Experience in research and audit is advantageous.
8. Maintain an up to date knowledge of current anaesthetic and Critical Care Medical Practice.

We require enthusiastic fully GMC registered doctors with at least three years anaesthetic training in RCA approved posts at SHO level or applicants who have completed equivalent training overseas. The department has an excellent reputation for teaching and will encourage and support doctors who wish to sit the Final FRCA.

The Hospital is a large friendly modern acute district general hospital with a full range of acute services on site and is only a two-minute walk from the beach. The successful candidates will be expected to help maintain the quality of anaesthetic services throughout the trust and will also be involved in the care of patients on the Obstetric Unit.

The Anaesthetic directorate currently consists of 19 Consultants, 3 Associate Specialists, 1 Staff Grade, 2 Specialty Doctors and 3 Clinical Assistants. There are 16 trainees, 8 Trust Doctors and FY1 doctor. There is an extensive educational programme to which Specialty Doctors are encouraged to attend.

The successful applicants will be encouraged to pursue any specialist interests and learn new skills and will be given the opportunity to participate in research and teaching within the department.

Main Duties:

We wish to recruit an individual to support the department in maintaining the quality of anaesthetic services throughout the Trust. The successful candidate will be expected to possess broad experience in all aspects of anaesthesia and must be prepared to participate in audit, teaching and the continued development of the service.

The successful applicant will be encouraged to promote and develop their own particular interests, and it may be possible to accommodate a particular subspecialty interest dependant upon the needs of the department at the time.

The post has an on-call commitment although applications will be considered from candidates who would prefer not to participate in an on-call rota, although this must be discussed with the clinical director prior to taking up the post.

The post attracts 10 PAs for weekly day time duties, plus an additional 2 PA's for on call commitments, with a rolling 10 week rota and a 1 in 10 resident on call commitment to comply with the European Working Time Directive. There are currently three resident anaesthetists out of hours and the successful applicant will be expected to offer support and advice to the junior doctors on call with them, which usually consists of an SHO covering theatres and either an SHO or registrar covering the intensive care unit. We have recently been able to ensure that all new anaesthetists are effectively supernumery for their first three months and hope that this will be able to continue.

Important Notes:
